

Panther football seeks return to glory

NEW RICHLAND – The New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva football team will rely on solid fronts on both sides of the ball to try to regain its winning ways.

The Panthers had worked their way to a 16-13 mark the previous three seasons before a disastrous 1-8 record in 2012. A return to winning ways is foremost on the minds of the Panthers in 2013.

Head coach Dan Stork begins his 20th year at NRHEG, 11th season as the head coach. He has led the Panthers to a 57-42 mark during his tenure.

Assistant coaches are John Schultz, Grant Berg, Taylor Holland and Andy Peterson.

NRHEG was winless in six Gopher/Valley Conference AA games last season and just 1-8 overall.

The Panthers graduated 13 seniors from their 2012 squad. Toughest to replace will be quarterback Casey Rosacker, running back Brad Claycomb and wide receiver Nic Mangskau.

Rosacker passed for close to 700 yards and doubled as a

defensive back. Claycomb rushed for 510 yards before being injured in week six. Mangskau, the team's top receiver, was injured in the fourth week and done for the year.

NRHEG will build around 12 returning lettermen, eight of whom were starters.

Three starters return in the line and give NRHEG some good size up front. They are senior Noah Krell (200 lbs.), senior Nick Goette (295 lbs.) and junior Keith Maxon (205 lbs.).

Krell plays right guard and defensive tackle. He started every game last season and four games as a sophomore. Goette plays tackle on both sides of the ball. This will be his third season as a starter. Maxon is a center and defensive tackle. He started every game at center as a sophomore.

"Noah is very smart and intense lineman. Nick is big and athletic with very good feet," said Stork. "Keith is a very strong and athletic lineman."

Three starters are back to help the receiving corps. Senior Dillon Parpart (200 lbs.), junior Spencer Tollefson (185 lbs.) and senior Preston Peterson (165 lbs.).

Parpart is a three-year starter at linebacker. He led the team with 99 tackles and five sacks a year

Tollefson started every game as a sophomore at tight end and strong safety. He led NRHEG with 12 catches for 202 yards and a touchdown.

Peterson started as a cornerback a year ago.

"Parpart is very physical and Tollefson is an intelligent and athletic player," said Stork.

A couple of returning lineback-

ers are junior Nic Bartness (185 lbs.) and Tyler

Logan (170 lbs.).

Bartness started every game at fullback and linebacker. Logan started six games at linebacker.

"Bartness loves to hit people," said Stork.

The remaining returning lettermen are senior Ross Chester (OL/DL) and juniors Trevor Tracy (QB/DB), Matt Jensen (OL/DL) and Keil; Sletten (WR/DB).

Stork is expecting three sopho-

mores to provide some immediate help. They are Wyatt Fitterer (260 lbs) at fullback/defensive line. Trai Wicks (160 lbs.) at wide receiver/quarterback/defensive back and John Weller (200 lbs.) at offensive and defensive line.

NRHEG has 39 players out in grades 10-12. The remaining candidates include juniors Jet Wayne (WR), Zach Stenzel (WR), Alex Merritt (RB), Colton Hagen (TE), Hudson Mrotz (OL)



Panther spikers will battle to the end

NEW RICHLAND – The New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva volleyball team knows how to win. Now it would like to see some rewards for winning.

The Panther spikers have chalked up 74 victories over the past four years, but have nothing to show for it.

NRHEG plays in the Gopher Conference with Faribault B.A., who has won 12 consecutive conference titles and 107 straight Gopher matches. And LeSueur and Jordan have been very strong opponents in Section 2AA.

First year head coach Onika Peterson would like to change that. This will be Peterson's initial season as a head coach.

She replaces Joe Kuechenmeister, who had a three-year record of 51-34 as head man of the Panther spikers.

Peterson will be assisted by former head coach Jackie Schultz and Corrine Schuller.

NRHEG ended the 2012 campaign with a 10-16-3 overall mark. The Panthers finished 3-4 in the Gopher Conference.

Peterson lost Noelle Bartness, Raelin Schue, Kalana Shurson, and Katie Cole from last year's squad. All of them were starters last season.

Bartness finished second in NRHEG history in assists with 1,722. She has the top two single-season assist records in Panther history.

Bartness was a three-year starter and two-time all-conference selection.

Schue was a two-year starter and solid outside hitter for the Panthers.

Shurson was a two-year starter as a defensive specialist.

Cole was a starting outside hitter for NRHEG a year ago.

"All of these players played significant roles and contributed to our success the past couple of years," said Peterson.

Five senior letterwinners return to ease Peterson into her initial season.

Middle hitter Carlie Wagner is back for her fourth season as a starter. She led the Panthers in kills, blocks and digs in 2012.

"People tend to overlook Carlie's competitiveness," said

Peterson. "She wants to win so much it carries over to her teammates, bringing their game to the next level."

Jade Schultz is back for her senior season. She is rehabbing a knee injury from last year's state basketball tournament so her status is somewhat unsure at this time.

Schultz, a two-year starter, led the team in service aces a year ago, and was second in digs and blocks.

"We are hoping for the best with Jade's rehab," said Peterson. "Her desire to win, scrappiness and bruiser-type attitude is someone you want playing for you."

Overgaard broke into the lineup as a starting outside

hitter last season.

"Paige's attack is hard to read which allows her to get kills,"


said Peterson. "She is a very versatile player who may see some time playing all the way around this season."

Lundberg brings her scrappiness to the floor as a defensive specialist.

"Hannah never gives up on a ball and is always giving her



"We want to be competitive and keep improving throughout the season," said Peterson. "Our toughest task will be to get pour girls fully committed to the next three months rather than looking ahead to bas-

As usual, FBA is the overwhelming conference favorite.

Le Sueur-Henderson, Belle Plaine and Jordan are Peterson's choices as section favorites.

"Our strengths will be our athletic ability, our scrappiness and the desire to compete," said Peterson. "We know that basketball is the priority. We need to be committed to volleyball for three months."

Peterson has 17 dates lined up on the

Panther schedule, including tournaments at Mankato West and Blue Earth. NRHEG has eight home dates and nine on the road, including five of the first six.

Alden-Conger comes to town Aug. 27th to open the season.

Conference play opens at Waterville-Elysian-Morristown Sept. 3rd.

Non-conference foes include Alden-Conger, Albert Lea, Le Sueur, Mankato East, Maple River and Tri-City United.

NEW RICHLAND – The New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva cross country teams will feature a couple of solid runners at the top of the lineup. But, team depth will once again be the deciding factor as to what kind of season the Panther boys and girls enjoy.

Head coach Mike Weber and assistant coach Lori Tomsche return intact for their fifth seasons. Increasing the numbers has been a top priority for each of their first four seasons.

Both the boys' and girls' teams would like to move up in the conference and section standings, but will need some untested runners to develop for that to happen.

Adam Anderson was named NRHEG's "Hardest Worker" last season. He and Johnson should battle for the second spot behind Schiltz.


Kellen Ferber is the fourth senior on the 2013 squad.



"I feel like there are some new faces on this team who might surprise us," said Weber. "We have to keep working to get stronger in order to move up in a tough conference and strong section."


Weber tabs USC, Mankato Loyola and Martin County West as the Gopher/Valley favorites.

The Panthers will be at home just once this fall. They hose their annual Panther Invite at Riverview Gold Course Sept. 17.


