Enclosed is a letter my 14-year-old son, Danny, wrote. He has a school trip planned to go to Washington, D.C. and see many wonderful historical sites. But most of all there was a chance to be selected to lay the wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.


In order to be considered, he had to be a kid of character, and submit an essay on why he wanted this honorable opportunity.

Danny wrote the enclosed essay. I thought maybe you would like to read it.

Your husband's act of kindness to Danny's grandpa Don made an impression – a huge impression. Our son is hard of hearing and wears a hearing aid, and very much wants to be in the military. He knows the reality of this, but to him, being involved in such an honor as laying the wreath is his way of being able to honor all those who served.

tened to me tell the story of your husband and his kindness. And to think of him and his kind act, and write about it!



Whether it was leaving your family or loved ones, you put your lives on the line for our freedom. Though after all this we still take it for granted, what you do is still very appreciated and we should give back.

I was going to write about my family and its many ties to the military. But then just recently, something happened.

A man I never met in my life, by the name of James R. Miller, served with my grandfather Donald Johnson during the Korean War, on the USS Brinkly Bass. During that time, James R. Miller and my grandfather became good

friends, along with some other shipmates, creating a strong bond, such a powerful camaraderie, only servicemen and women truly understand. Miller, it's that you should go out of your way for others. Even if you have absolutely no idea who this veteran is, they stood up for you. Now it is your turn to do something for them.







Many veterans developed mesothelioma years after their Navy careers had ended. Navy veterans who have been diagnosed with mesothelioma have a right to seek compensa-
